

# Pre-Lesson Comprehension

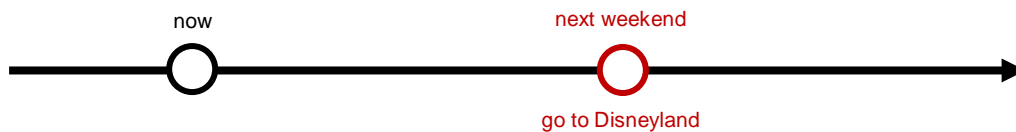
Target Language: *will (statements)*

Focus: You will learn *will* to talk about the future.

Read and understand the target language below.

We use **will** to talk about any action or event that happens in the future. The structure is: **will + base verb**.

- He **will go** to Disneyland next weekend.



We usually make contractions for the future tense, especially when speaking.

I <b>will</b>	I'll	we <b>will</b>	we'll
you <b>will</b>	you'll		
he <b>will</b>	he'll	they <b>will</b>	they'll
she <b>will</b>	she'll		
it <b>will</b>	it'll		

We use **will** three different ways. However, all of these actions / events happen in the future.

### There isn't a plan:

- A: Did you buy new boots for camping yet?  
B: No, but I'll **buy** some boots soon.

### When you have just made a decision:

- A: There's a sale at the sports store until Saturday. Everything is 25% off.  
B: Really? Then I'll **buy** new boots tomorrow.

### When you guess about the future:

- A: What's the weather like tomorrow?  
B: It **will rain**.

For negative sentences, we use: **will + not + base verb**. **Will not** is usually shortened to **won't**.

- I **will not go** to class today. I don't feel well.
- She **won't see** her friends this weekend.
